Definitions:

Blood Pressure Monitoring:

Blood pressure monitoring is defined as the use of a non-invasive blood pressure monitor with vital signs being monitored more frequently than every hour

Continuous Blood Pressure Monitoring:

Drugs requiring continuous blood pressure monitoring (at a minimum of q5min and where a physician is available in-house to attend immediately to STAT calls.)

Cardiac Monitor:

The patient must be connected to a cardiac monitor and the Nurse giving the drug must have acquired the competency of arrhythmia interpretation.

Respiratory Support:

There must be an oral airway, manual ventilatory support (resuscitation bag), airway suctioning and oxygen equipment within close proximity.
