## Appendix B: Procedure for Instillation

- 1. Gather supplies:
  - a. #14 Fr Foley catheter
  - b. Catheter tray
  - c. Incontinent pads
  - d. Lidocaine 2% gel with physician's order
  - e. Sterile gloves

## The nurse will:

- 1. Gather equipment
- 2. Introduce yourself to the patient
- 3. Identify the patient using two unique patient identifiers
- 4. Explain procedure to the patient
- 5. Have patient undress and put on gown
- 6. Clean work surface
- 7. Clean hands
- 8. Position and drape patient
- 9. Place incontinent pads under the patient
- 10. Clean hands
- 11. Insert foley catheter as per standard procedure maintaining sterile technique
- 12. If blood is present, Stop and notify Physician before continuing with procedure
- 13. Leave catheter in place allowing the bladder to drain completely of urine
- 14. Remove gloves
- 15. Clean hands
- 16. Apply Nitrile gloves
- 17. Remove the protector cap from the BCG medication administration tube and attach it to the Foley catheter
- 18. Turn the stopcock handle so that the OFF position points to the vial
- 19. Instill the suspension into the bladder slowly over one minute
- 20. Turn the stopcock handle to the catheter
- 21. Remove foley catheter as per standard procedure
- 22. Encase the catheter and medication set with the disposable pad
- 23. Dispose of materials into the cytotoxic waste container
- 24. Help the patient with cleaning of the genital area if necessary
- 25. Remove gloves and gown and dispose into cytotoxic waste container
- 26. Clean hands
- 27. Remove eye protection and N95 mask and dispose into cytotoxic waste container
- 28. Clean hands
- 29. Offer the patient an incontinence pad (to take home)
- 30. Patient may be discharged home with discharge instructions and education
- 31. Document procedure in the Patient health record.

- f. Sterile nitrile gloves
- g. Disposable wash cloths
- h. Pre-mixed BCG
- i. Eye protection
- j. N95 mask
- k. Chemo gown
